Sarah has acted in many prominent aviation cases and acted for the claimant in the landmark case of *Rogers v Hoyle* [2014] EWCA Civ 257 [2014] 3 WLR 148, [2014] 3 All ER 550, which considered the admissibility of air safety reports in UK civil proceedings. In January 2023 she featured as Lawyer of the Week in The Times for her work representing families of the victims of the Shoreham Airshow disaster throughout the coroner's inquest which concluded on 20 December 2022 with a finding of unlawful killing.
