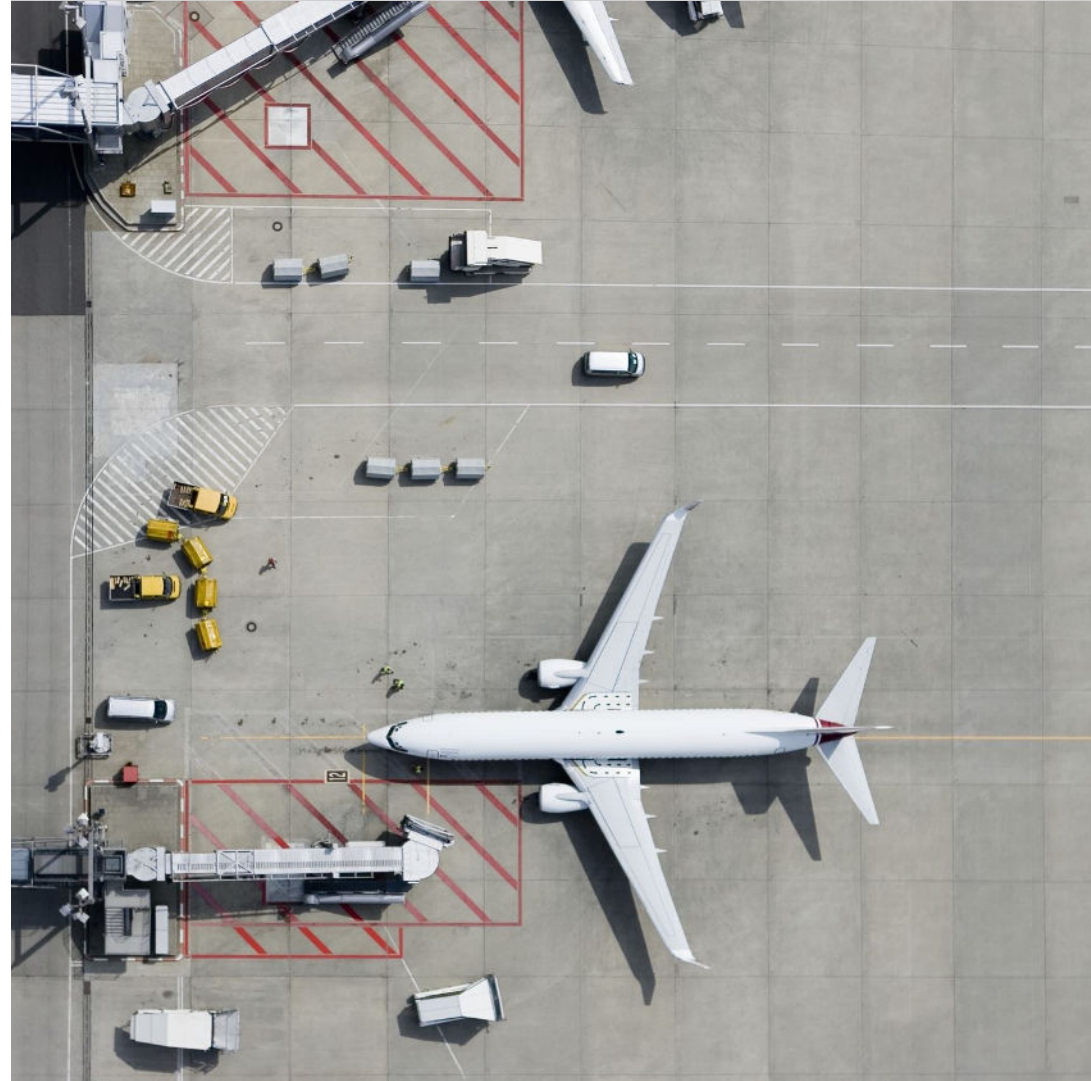

- Core Aviation Insurance policy coverage : Insured's legal liability for damages for Bodily Injury and/or Property Damage caused by an Occurrence arising out of the Insured's business as owner and/or operator of the Airport
 - Operators and owners : different responsibilities/scopes.
 - What are airport operations' scope: narrow or extended ?
- Scope of Aviation Insurance policies and Corporate Liability Insurance policies vary from one policy to another

- Cyber : Aviation policies do not cover Cyber
- Complex relationships between airport owners and airport operators
- Airport operators often reallocate responsibilities to ground handlers / subcontractors
- Contracts can be affected by special liability regimes
- Worldwide mergers and acquisitions by major airport operators facing multiple legal environments
- Terrorism: Brussels and Istanbul airports' attacks showed that Airports are a target for terrorists – Who is liable for security ?
