

## When might one want to use reconstruction evidence?

- The role of Public Prosecutors and Criminal Proceedings (and evidence gathering)
- Court appointed experts?
- Can the parties obtain their own reports?
- Jointly or independently instructed experts?




#### **Expert Reports**

- Qualifications of the Experts:
  - Engineers?
  - Police Officers?
  - Others?
- Does the expert owe a duty to the party commissioning / funding their report or is there an overarching duty to the Court?
- Are there any formalities that a report must comply with?
- Is there a duty to disclose your report ahead of negotiations / Court hearings?
- Is 'expert shopping' permissible?

#### Evidence before the Courts

- Admissibility of evidence
- Are there any limitations on the evidence that may be called?
- Is the Court's permission required to adduce reconstruction evidence?
- What weight is placed on Reconstruction evidence?
- Are the findings made earlier criminal proceedings binding on a civil claim?
- How are differing opinions resolved by the Courts:
  - Expert vs Expert
  - Expert vs Police
  - Joint reports of the experts setting out areas of agreement / disagreement
  - Cross-examination of experts?
  - Decisions on paper?
