Legal and Practical Challenges

Legal position of claimants – Complex procedures, often unequal battle with insurers

Vulnerability of claimants – Trauma, language and cultural barriers, financial and emotional stress

Risk – Without empowerment, claimants become discouraged or isolated

Empowerment in Practice

Legal: Fighting for recognition of medical causality, access to expertise

Human: Taking victims seriously, working culturesensitively, restoring trust

Vision: Claimants are not 'cases', but people.

Empowerment = legal protection and restoring autonomy and dignity

Protective Measures in the Netherlands

BEM-clause: Mandatory in cases involving minors with long-term injuries, ensuring protection of settlement amounts

Partial dispute procedure ('deelgeschil'): A faster, simplified court procedure to resolve key issues efficiently

Protective administration ('bewind'): Court-appointed financial administrator to safeguard assets of vulnerable individuals

Other Protective Measures in the Netherlands

Curatorship
('curatele'): Full legal
incapacity measure for
adults who cannot
manage their own affairs

Mentorship ('mentorschap'): Courtappointed mentor for personal care and welfare decisions
