





to rejoin the Lugano Convention. The suggestion from the EU Commission previously that accession to Lugano depends on participation (even if only partially) in the EU's single market is not supported by a literal or purposive interpretation of Lugano. Furthermore, it overlooks the status of Northern Ireland under the Windsor Framework and the reality of the close alignment between the EU and UK under the Trade and Cooperation Agreement; close alignment which is to be further bolstered following the EU-UK summit and reset in May 2025. The present position does arguably demonstrate the UK's partial participation in the single market.


In the alternative to Lugano, <u>a new bi-lateral arrangement</u> is required between the EU and UK that ensures full protection for injury victims on the combined issues of jurisdiction and enforcement.
